SMALL INTERVENTIONS CAN HAVE MASSIVE IMPACTS ON PEOPLE'S LIVES

The Limpopo Provincial Treasury will be donating items worth R 5,000 to the female inmates serving jail terms and their children of the Matatshe Prisons. The items include blankets, sanitary towels, slippers, baby bottles and toys, clothing and varieties of toiletries. The donation forms part of activities marking the Women's month that are coordinated by Transformation Services directorate and the Women's Forum.

In an interview with RIFUMO NEWS, the senior manager for Transformation Services Ms. Anna Oliphant said "It was not the fault of some of the inmates to find themselves in prison with children, hence the need for society to extend love and kindness to them. Last year, the department collected sanitary towels for the young girls in support

of Youth month to assist those who cannot afford to buy during their menstrual cycle. They were donated to school girls in all five districts and some of the recipient even cried"

A meeting between the prison's staff and transformation services has already taken place. The items will be donated on the 20 August 2013, at Matatshe Prisons.


