Phetwane Village as one of the regions that make a green footprint on the Masibambane Rural Initiative. hosted the National President Mr. Jacob Zuma. The President broke the tradition of giving speeches by participating in the 67 minutes of harvesting hundreds of hectares of maize at the Phetwane Irrigation Scheme. The massive harvest was joined by hundreds of community members, employees of the Phetwane Irrigation Scheme, hand-to-hand with traditional leaders, the District, local municipal councilors and employees. The President was accompanied by Agriculture Minister Tina Joemat-Petterson as well as Ministers and Deputy Ministers, the newly elected Premier of Limpopo Stan Mathabatha with MECs

including Ishmael Kgetjepe of Local government and Traditional Affairs and Rudolf Phala of Treasury. President Zuma viewed the Masibambane Rural Development Initiative as a way that will improve the lives of rural communities like Phetwane. He also called on neighbouring villages to learn from Phetwane village and take initiative as this will help rural communities to stop relying mainly on social grants and reduce poverty. MEC RUDOLPH PHALA ADDRESSES SPECIAL MUNICIPAL CFO'S FORUM

The MEC is not pleased by the performance of the municipalities. He said this when he was addressing the special municipal CFO's forum at MJ Gateway on thursday morning "In our Province of Limpopo only 1 of the 30 local and district Municipalities received a clean audit. 14 of the 30 Municipalities obtained declaimers compared to 8 in the previous financial year of 2010/11. Twelve received qualifications compared to 13 in the previous year 2010/11. Only 1 municipality received a clean audit compared to 2 in 2010/11. Positively only one municipality received an adverse audit opinion compared to 4 in the previous year, and only one municipality is unqualified opinion compared to 3 in the previous year" said the MEC

He also said that "the National Treasury attributes these to what they call serious financial management and political challenges facing Municipalities in the Limpopo Province"

These are the cause of all our woes, amongst others, are 'Poor financial management capacity, inappropriately qualified staff and high staff turnover in the Budget and Treasury offices of Municipalities. There is also a general lack of adherence to existing policies and procedures, SCM and governance". MEC e mphasised .

He encouraged CFO's to do their utmost best because when the municipality receives a negative audit opinion they are the first to be blamed. "the National Treasury attributes these to what they call serious finan cial managemen"

They were reminded to discharge their responsibilities within the confines of the legal framework and they must ensure that they submit annual financial statements that are free of material misstatement and aligned to Treasury frameworks.

There is a dedicated team from both CoGHSTA and Provincial Treasury to provide support to municipalities. Therefore, CFO's must use these available resources to improve the current state of audit outcomes.

1. Accessing departmental email via the internet
